21 March 2013 - A team from the Philippine Embassy in Berlin, Germany composed of Ms. Flordeliza Delos Santos, Ms. Melinda Hernais, Ms. Lianna Judith Sale and Ms. Lota Fajardo of the Embassy's Consular Section conducted a mobile consular outreach service at Pfarrkirche St. Ignatius in Frankfurt am Main – Innenstadt on March 16.

The four-member consular team facilitated 235 e-passport applications, four (4) replacement of lost passports, 32 notarials and certifications, 10 civil registrations, and nine (9) authentication of documents.

Service hours were extended until past midnight to accommodate the huge number of Filipino applicants. Fr. Benedicto Pola allowed the use of the parish hall to allow the consular team to process all applications.

Ms. Cecile Joy Atienza-Krause, Consular Assistant of the Philippine Honorary Consul in Stuttgart, was present to help manage the flow of applicants and ensure order during the activity. The consular team was further assisted by Filipino volunteers.

Philippine Ambassador to Germany Maria Cleofe R. Natividad expressed her appreciation to the Filipino community in Frankfurt, particularly Fr. Pola and Fr. Melchor Braga, for their support to the Embassy's consular outreach. END
