

16 March 2013 – The Australian Capital Territory, Canberra, marked its 100th year anniversary on March 12.

Several activities were organized since February and throughout this year to celebrate the territory's centenary. The highlight of the activities was the whole day *"WELCOME HOME"* Project along Lake Burley Griffith on Monday, March 11, which was participated in by the different nationalities and cultures in Australia including the Philippines.
